Scott Rudd, Assistant Director of Waycross Camp & Conference Center, presented a slide show showing the facility's multi-training programs for youth & young adults. The facility consists of 10 cabins for 100 people, meeting rooms, a large auditorium with seating for 300 people, an art center with 3 studios and a commercial kitchen. Waycross is a non-profit organization which is fully funded and endowed by the Episcopal Dioceses of Southern Indiana. Scott is Director of Leadership Brown Co. and a member of Long Term Recovery Committee for B.C.
