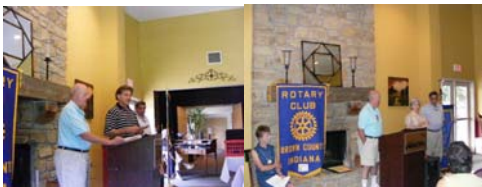

International Service designated their monetary awards to Rotary International for two water projects to provide clean water to people in countries where water and sanitation issues are obstacles to health and prosperity. Both projects are in partnership with other U.S. and international Rotary clubs. Wells and purification systems were constructed in a remote, mountainous area of north east Mexico. The other project is in Myanmar, where water pumping systems are being installed at some of the many orphanages in that country. Carrel Moore, chairperson for International Service Committee, explained the presentations as well as our club’s commitment to helping eradicate polio worldwide.
